

Denny Dahle will be organizing the club's participation. Please contact Denny to sign up for the parade. Let's make this a great parade! koda06@bellsouth.net





A "New" Old Car By Bob Ridle

For the first time since 2002 Ann and I have added a car, and more surprisingly perhaps, it's not another typical-of-us independent makes from the 1950's. It's a Ford!

What would cause such a wild deviation in our nature that we would not be searching for a Kaiser to sit alongside our Studebaker and Hudson? It has everything to do with Florida's weather. It's HOT down here! As much as we love driving our 50's orphans, they do not have, nor did they offer air conditioning. And we quickly found out, especially during the summer months, "Hot" could be brutal for us. Now, in case you are wondering, yes, we did briefly consider adding an aftermarket under-the-dash type system, but we didn't want to impact the "collector-car value" of our cars.
