### **Howdy Fellow TCVCCer's!**

September is upon us, and as I write this, I remember many Labor day holidays of past which were usually spent battered down waiting for one hurricane or another. Thankfully this Labor



day appears to be less menacing. I thought I would hedge my bets by having a fully automatic home generator – Generac with all the bells and whistles which would surely mean that I would never need it. Well after several months, going way back to June, everything has been installed and wired- except there is no generator. The usual story about supply chain problems being the standard excuse.

Remember that leaky power steering hose on my '64 GTO. It's all fixed now for the tame sum of \$22 for a new pressure hose delivered to my house. Very inexpensive, though the cost of power steering fluid certainly made up for that. With that out of the way, the next action item was the exhaust leak at the mating surface of the header to the heads.

At the suggestion of Larry Atkins, I purchased a set of Remflex exhaust manifold gaskets. They sat at the house taunting me for a month. I knew there was no glory in changing this gasket as headers are truly tools of the devil. I was fortunate that all bolts loosened without too much aggravation, though some allowed very little turn per try.

Again Larry bailed me out by grinding down a 7/16" inch open wrench which sped the job up significantly, and the new gasket is installed, and working as it should. I checked the opposite side and found that all bolts were tight. With the air conditioning compressor on that side, it would be more of an effort to change that one. I saved the second gasket for a later time (hopefully never).

### The Dodge Brothers Club Annual Meet

Sunday April 23, 2022 - Thursday April 28, 2022 - Charleston, SC. by Barb & Ed Joyce

We have been members of this club since the early 80's and this was our first meet that we had the opportunity to attend with our 1928 Graham Brothers Canopy Express Truck. The Dodge Brothers Club was founded in 1983 and its purpose is the research and preservation of Dodge Brothers Motor Vehicles and Graham Brothers Commercial Vehicles from 1914 through 1938, and the history of the people and company behind these vehicles.

We loaded up the Graham Brothers and headed to Charleston, SC early on Sunday morning for the 9-hour drive to Charleston. Once we arrived without any problems we were greeted with open arms and smiles. We saw people we haven't seen for over 18 years and made many new club friends. Once we got checked in at the hotel and got the Graham Brothers off the trailer, we all gathered for an Ice Cream Social & Welcome.

**Day 1**:The next morning, we had our first drivers meeting then headed off to our first tour. Please note that we all drove our OLD cars / trucks to ALL the tours. They had what you call a "Trouble Truck" that followed the group if there were any breakdowns.

Our first tour was to the Hunley Civil War Submarine at the Warren Lasch Conservation Center. In 1864, the Hunley became the world's first successful combat submarine. She mysteriously vanished and was lost for over a century after destroying the USS Housatonic ship in the harbor of Charleston. The Hunley was finally found in 1995 and raised from the sea in 2000.



The Hunley is now in a 75,000-gallon tank filled with sodium hydroxide solution designed to leach out the salts threatening the submarine. The solution is mainly to loosen up the rock-like- layer of sand, sediment, and rust. All of the 8-man crew members remains where respectfully removed and were given a proper confederate burial.

After the tour we all got back in our old vehicles and drove to the Magnolia Cemetery. This is an old Revolutionary and Civil War Cemetery. We drove our old

vehicles around the old cemetery plots and got a walking tour. We even saw the last resting place of the Hunley Crew.

Then we had lunch at Golden Corral and headed to our last tour of the day. The

North Charleston Fire Museum. When you enter the museum, it resembles a classic fire house with vaulted 20-foot ceilings. Home of the largest collection of fully restored American LaFrance Fire Apparatus in the country. It has a collection of over twenty fully restored fire vehicles. Some of these trucks have details such as hand-laid 24 gold leaf scroll work. Truly amazing!



**Day 2**: The next morning, we left in the Graham Brothers to the Angel Oak Tree that is located on St. John's Island. The oak derives its name from the estate of Justus Angel and his wife, Martha Waight Tucker Angel. Local folklore tells stories of ghosts of former enslaved people appearing as angels around the tree. This one tree covers over an acre of land. Angel Oak is thought to be one of the oldest tree (400+ years) east of Mississippi River.



Then we headed to the Charleston Tea Garden for a tour and lunch on Wadmalaw Island. There we got a private bus tour of the Tea Gardens and a Factory Tour. They are the only tea garden in North America where you can see hundreds of thousands of tea bushes stretching out acre after acre for almost as far as the eye can see.

After lunch we headed to Holy City Brewing where we had a chance to relax and enjoy conversation with some old friends. We each had a coupon for a free brew or soft drink.

Why the name Holy City Brewing? Charleston is believed to be called the "Holy City" because of its history of religious tolerance + abundant places of worship. Today, the city skyline is defined by over 400 church steeples and many different religions are practiced around town.

Day 3: After our drivers meeting, we were off to Boone Hall Plantation and Gardens When you first drive in, it is over whelming with the world-famous Avenue of Oaks forming a beautiful corridor. These oaks were planted in 1743 by Captain Thomas Boone. It took over 200 years for the trees to meet overhead to form the present-day scenic corridor. Once we parked our vehicles, we got a private tour of the plantation mansion and the beautiful blooming gardens. In-



teresting facts: The movie "North & South" with Patrick Swayze was filmed there. Also "The Notebook" to name a few. We saw 8 remaining brick buildings where the slaves lived. An average of 12 people. 2 families lived in one building. Then we had a live performance of the "Gullah Culture", and about their "Sweetgrass Baskets".

Our next stop was to Sullivan's Island to Fort Moultrie and Fort Sumter National Monument for a picnic lunch and a tour of the fort. Fort Moultrie in one of the United States most historic coastal defense site, Fort Moultrie protected the city of Charleston and its strategically important harbor for more than a century and a half. On our way back to our hotel, we accidently made a wrong turn and ended up on the Charleston Express way. Semi-trucks passing us going 75 miles was quite nerve wracking, but fortunately in about ½ mile down the road the traffic slowed down to 30 miles an hour which was the perfect speed for us. 5 miles later we got off our exit with no problem. And yes, once we got back to the hotel, Barb had a gin and tonic!

**Day 4**: No one drove their old vehicles. Instead, we had a tour bus pick us up at the hotel and got a tour of downtown Charleston, some historical buildings and Citadel College. Then we had time to do some shopping in some cute and unique shops. Once we got back to our hotel, we drove our Graham Brothers across the street to the Tanger Outlet Mall with all the other old Dodges and had our own car show with pizza. That evening we sat down for a great banquet meal. We received a gift from the club since it was our first time we attended a Dodge Brothers Tour Meet and also won first place for our Graham Brothers at the show.

We also had the honor to meet and talk to John Van Lennep, the grandson of John Dodge. One of the two Dodge Brothers who co-founded the Dodge Motor Company. He loved hearing our story about our Graham Brothers and found out that he lives in Delray Beach, Florida.

This tour was great! Very organized and professionally done. It was so cool to drive with all the older cars and our Graham Brothers drove like it

just came out of the showroom. Started up every time and drove without any problems. A total of 195 miles.
