May 21, 2023 Hosted by Bob and Ann Ridle

On a pleasant Sunday morning in May members of the Treasure Coast Region/AACA assembled in the parking lot of the Wells Fargo Bank off Rt. 1 and Walton Road in Port Saint Lucie for our caravan northward to visit the Auto Tech Department at Indian River State College in Fort Pierce.

Once there, Director Brian Woodrow took members through the facilities and explained the courses used to educate, train, and certify today's Automotive Technicians. With their heavy use of sophisticated computerized systems, today's vehicles are far more complicated and challenging to diagnose and repair, and IRSC's Auto Tech Department gets today's techs ready to handle those issues.





But, as Brian pointed out, many of the service needs of today's vehicles remain essentially the same as cars and trucks from years ago. Diagnosis and repair of axles, bearings, brakes, differentials, CV joints, exhaust systems, even engine rebuilding remains much the same, so these fundamental skills are taught as well.

Students completing the course at IRSC not only have the certifications they'll need for employment, but also an Associate of Applied Science

Degree in Automotive Service Management.

At the conclusion of the tour, and the club's General Meeting, 1st VP Bob Ridle presented Brian Wood-row with a donation from the club of \$150.00 to help support the Auto Tech Department's scholarship fund.

TCVCC MEMBER RUSS CATERINICCHIO ACHIEVES "BEST OF SHOW" AT SOUTH FORK HS CAR SHOW

Russ Caterinicchio of Port St. Lucie won "Best of Show" at the First Annual Automotive Academy Car Show held at Martin County School District South Fork High School in Stuart on Saturday, March 25th. Russ's 1993 Mazda RX-7 FD3S-RB Series 6 took top prize among a large field of private and various club member entries.

This two-rotor "Sunburst Yellow" Mazda coupe has been completely restored during the last three years including numerous reliability and performance modifications personally made by Cameron Worth of legendary Pettit Racing in West Palm Beach. ("Cam" Worth is internationally recognized for winning the Rolex 24-Hour GT race by overcoming the Porsche team with his #75 two-rotor RX-7.) The new motor was handbuilt (autographed), street-ported, balanced and blueprinted producing 325 brake horsepower for a vehicle weighing less than 2700



pounds. This car is Stage Two track ready. The restoration was finally finished in August when the two seats were completely overhauled by Lane's Trim Shop in Stuart using imported Italian black Alcantara suede with "Sunflower Yellow" stitching emulating the OEM style and patterns.



Mathematics teacher and coach Sean Gregors and faculty helped to facilitate the event; but the students planned, organized, supervised, and juried the show. The show was a huge success raising funds to help these young men and women continue their careers as certified mechanics and specialized technicians, as well as to encourage an appreciation for classic cars and vintage motoring.

This year's South Fork High School Car

Show was hosted by the Martin County School District Automotive Academy. Under this program, students in grades 9-12 study all aspects of automotive maintenance and light repairs. All students completing this curriculum upon high school graduation immediately earn 12 general education credits at Indian River State College. The Automotive Academy program is industry certified by the National Institute for Automotive Excellence (ASE) and the Florida Automobile Dealers Association (FADA).

Kril M. Jackson, 86, of Palm City, passed away on Monday, June 5, 2023 in Stuart, FL.

A long time resident of South Florida, Kril was born on November 27, 1936 in Odin, IL to the Rev. Cyril Mervin and Blanche Moore Jackson. He is survived by his wife of 66 years, Pearl Ann Jackson, daughters Kerri Jackson (Terry Gilbert) of Port St. Lucie, FL and Kristina Jackson (Colin Whitworth) of Ottawa, Ontario. Kril is also survived by his brothers, George W. Jackson (Karen) of Pleasant Hill, MO and Joseph Charles Jackson of Dearborn, MI. His memory will also be treasured by granddaughters Lucinda Pearl and Summer Rose Whitworth of Ontario, Canada.

Kril attended Western Illinois University in Macomb, IL and graduated with a B.A. from McKendree College in 1957.

He served in the U.S. Army in Mannheim, Germany during the Cold War.

Since moving from Miami to Palm City in 1989, Kril was an active member of Treasure Coast Vintage Car Club (TCVCC), serving as President in 1997 and 2001. As proud owners of a 1956 Ford Thunderbird, Kril and Pearl enjoyed many outings with their TCVCC friends.

Along with his wife, Kril traveled extensively, visiting 7 continents. Kril enjoyed a long career in Human Resources, retiring from the State of Florida Dept. of Corrections in 2000.

Kril's collection of Sherlock Holmes memorabilia and books was so notable as to be featured in The Miami Herald.

Kril was known for his dry wit, intelligence and compassion for others.

Funeral arrangements are being handled by the Neptune Society. A family service will be held at a later date. Kril will be buried in Illinois.
