Stahl's Automotive Museum

Every August I take a break from the Florida heat and head to Michigan spectate at the Detroit Woodward Dream Cruise and Flint's Back to the Bricks Cruise-in. I also make time to hit a museum or two.

Just outside the Detroit area, there is a museum that has been steadily gaining lots of recognition in Chesterfield, Michigan called the Stahl's Automotive Foundation Museum. https://www.stahlsauto.com/ It is only open on Tuesdays from 1 PM to 4 PM which has fooled/annoyed me a few times! It's FREE (and of course they accept donations). Ted and Mary Stahl do lots of charity work.



The collection (over 100 immaculate vehicles) begins with carriage-like cars from as old as 1886. I am always struck by their 1904 Oldsmobile curved dash which is what I think of as a "real" automobile. There are many great (mostly BIG) luxury cars from the 10's, 20's and 30's with interesting history.

The 1911 American Eagle (big red car with lots of brass) caught my eye this year. The Eagle Motor Car company in Detroit only made one car - this one!



Other cars I noted in the main room included a green 1936 Supercharged Auburn 852 Speedster convertible and the blue 1919 Pierce Arrow model 66 A-4 Tourer famously owned by silent film star Roscoe "Fatty" Arbuckle. Harley Earl designed the body for this car before he became Chief Designer for General Motors!





Stahl's Automotive Museum, continued...

The most popular cars in this museum however are probably the 1948 Tucker and 1963 Chrysler Turbine cars which are segregated away from the rest in their own section. The Tucker display includes an entertaining original sales marketing movie that plays continuously. The Stahl Tucker is complete and runs. I believe that all of the cars in this collection run.





There are also a couple of Tucker engines nearby on engine stands to study. On one wall there is some Hollywood information about how the movie "Tucker" was made. This Stahl museum car as well as a few others appeared in the movie.

The Stahl Museum 1963 Chrysler Turbine car is very original and all shined up. Jay Leno also owns one of these and accidentally burned up his engine a few years ago. Ted Stahl gave Jay a lot of leads to help get Jay's car running again. Williams International, a defense contractor in Pontiac, MI that makes gas turbine engines for cruise missiles was the key lead. Volunteers

and retired engineers eagerly helped out. Astonishingly, some of them were once employees of Chrysler in the 1960s that worked on the Chrysler turbine car program back then. Small world.





Stahl's Automotive Museum, continued...

There is a large, separate section of the museum dedicated to music machines. These large, machines in heavy, highly polished wood cabinets were commonly used like jukeboxes for public and private entertainment. Most operate something like a player piano using perforated rolls. Aside from the piano, they also include additional musical instruments; typically drums and banjos or violins. These mechanical monsters are fascinating to watch when demonstrated. The Stahl also has a dozen or so Wurlitzer juke boxes in immaculate shape.





Back in the main "car" section, there is a full size Wurlitzer pipe organ (1500+ pipes) built in 1923 that plays brief tunes for visitors about every 15 minutes. It's been modified to play by computer control but can also be played manually or with perforated paper rolls of course. The sound is really good! It played "Chitty, Chitty, Bang, Bang" while I was there. It was originally installed in the Cincinnati, Ohio mansion of the Wurlitzer founder and there is no record of it ever having been sold or invoiced at the company. Must have "fallen off a truck" as they say. The percussion section includes a Marimba, Xylophone, Glockenspiel, Chimes, Celesta, Vibraphone, Piano and tuned Sleigh Bells. "trap" Percussions include Snare Drum, Cymbals, Castanets, Tambourines, as well as silent movie sound effects like bird whistles, Door Bells, Surf, Slide Whistle, Lo-

comotive Whistle and of course—auto horn!
