

Let me start by saying this brief article does not cover the 100's of beautifully restored vehicles that covered the show field for Friday's judging event. Your next edition of *Antique Automobile* will do that nicely. I'm confining my observations to the area where most folks spend the first 4 days of this event...the vendor fields.

What can I tell you about this year's Hershey Show that's different from years past? Not much, and that's a good thing, because the Hershey Region's show lived up to its "Largest Antique Car Show & Flea Market in the World" slogan once again.

Over the years, the numbers (vendors, show cars, car corral vehicles, etc.) have declined a bit, but this event is still amazing to me in its breadth and scope.

If you've never been, be prepared to walk...a lot, or rent a cart. There are over 9,000 vendor spaces spread out over 330 acres. The Hershey Region pulls together over 800 volunteers to pull their show off. Someone once calculated that if you walked every row on all the fields you would have covered 21 miles! However, you don't have to wander aimlessly hoping to stumble over the part or service you're looking for because Hershey has an excellent printed program with detailed maps and a listing of every parts vendor and service being offered and where you can find them.


Hershey, continued...

By the way, since car enthusiasts from all over the world come to this show, you will hear other languages being spoken, guaranteed. It's not uncommon to hear languages from all around the world. This year I heard Arabic, German, Swedish, Italian, Japanese (I think) and Portuguese. I even sat at a food vendor's table with a group from Poland...nice folks, Dzien dobry! No, I did not offer to pick up their tab.

For me what made this year's Hershey experience stand out from years past was the temperature. Over the years I've experienced rain, cold temps, cool fall days, even a little skiff of snow. But Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday were unusually hot for PA in the fall. The morning temps felt typically cool, but by afternoon we were in the upper 80's...pounding down on the acres of asphalt that make up the vendor areas surrounding the Giant Center. What? A Floridian complaining about heat in Pennsylvania? Well...yes. You see I goofed, I should have paid more attention to the forecast. I saw the part about cool morning temps, patchy fog, with sunshine later. Paying no attention to the predicted highs, I put on my jeans, grabbed my coat and hat and headed out the door. The sequence of pictures shown here pretty much tell the story of my transition from the first day to the second day!

As you can see, by the second day I was back in my Florida togs! The abundant sunshine combined with the asphalt surface of the vendor area made the "feels like" temperature more like 100!
