There was no Old Business to bring before the general membership.



# Historic Green Gables

While viewing posts about upcoming car shows in our area a post appeared from Ray Greenwood who is a local old car enthusiast that has an old Dodge similar to Larry Ankrom's 1918 Dodge Touring. The post displayed a flyer for a car show at an historic

home location in Melbourne Florida January 21,2024. After reviewing the flyer and visiting the website: Greengables.org I found that this is the 3rd annual show and a lot of older (20's, 30's, 40's etc. vehicles) were displayed the 2 previous years. The \$20.00 entry fee included a docent tour of the historic home that was built in 1896.

The home was built by William and Nora Wells as a vacation home and they eventually retired in the home. At the time they built the home it included 130 acres of land with it (imagine what that would be worth now) but now is only 1 1/3 acres. It had a few additions along the years to enlarge the living area. During the 128 years it has been there the descendants lost interest and it fell into disrepair. It was scheduled to be torn down until a group of people formed a non-profit corporation in 2010 to preserve historical locations in Melbourne and their focus was the Green Gables home. The corporation was able to



raise enough funds to purchase the home in 2023. The tour was interesting and both Barb and I agreed that the home needs a lot of work but it seems that they have the enthusiasm to repair it.

The car show is one of many fund raisers they hold to finance the restoration work.



The Melbourne Model A club had front row parking up next to the house. We were parked at the entrance to the yard from the street in a nice spot. A lot of interesting cars attended including an Oldsmobile Tornado, 2 Nash Metropolitans, a 1948 Cadillac Limousine, a Corvair, a Rambler, etc. Live music played most of the show and there were a lot of spectators from the area. Despite the cool temperatures it was a nice show with the historic backdrop of a 128 year old home.
