On the morning of February 25th, a large group of club members left Cracker Barrell for the scenic drive on the backroads to the Busch Wildlife Sanctuary. 46 people turned out for the guided tour of the new facility in Jupiter.

The Busch Wildlife Sanctuary is a non-profit organization with over 40 years of dedication to the protection and conservation of Florida's wildlife and natural resources. To accomplish this goal the Sanctuary has a two fold mission of wildlife rehabilitation and environmental education.

The new facility consists of almost 20 acres dedicated to their mission to rescue, rehabilitate and release injured animals, while educating children and adults about native plant and animal species, and allowing them to participate in conservation efforts to protect and preserve Florida's wildlife, natural resources, and endangered species.

A Tale of Two Trucks.

Some of our long-time TCVCC members may remember the 1986 Ford F-150 long-bed pick-up truck I bought in North Carolina nearly 20 years ago. It carried us on several Cracker tours and others. (Photo at right)

When I bought the F-150---in 2004--it was supposed to be a kick-around "service truck" up in Brevard, NC, for when we came up from Stuart to tend to rental properties. It was just an old used truck. But it was solid, original with no rust and low mileage for 17 years. However, one thing led to another with new paint and various upgrades, and eventually it became pretty respectable as a vintage vehicle.



In the meantime what I really lusted for was a Dodge Ram short bed single cab in the early '90s the first year of the "big rig" style.

I could never find one that was to my liking and in my price range. So—just a few months ago--I decided to keep the F-150, bite the bullet and do all the stuff the old Ford needed to bring It up to snuff cosmetically and mechanically as a 37-year-old survivor. \$5000 worth, to be exact, including new premium tires, all kinds of maintenance (pan gasket, intake gasket, valve cover gaskets, main bearing seal, motor mounts, harmonic balancer, oil pump, new seat upholstery, etc. etc.). When all was finally said and done It was better than ever. I was ready to keep it. But, of course, I remained ever vigilant for that elusive Ram.

Ironically, just weeks after the work was completed on the F-150, a mirage showed up on-line: the



image of none other than a 1994 Dodge Ram Sport with a Magnum 360 engine in pristine condition with 49,000 documented miles for sale at a do-able price. I already figured it had to be in Spokane...or Columbus,,,or even Los Angeles. No. Further reading revealed it was in nearby Mills River, NC, just half an hour away!

I had to go look. It was Sunday and no one was around. But there it was on the back line of a used car lot Carol and I had passed by a hundred times. So I visited the next day and drove it. It was truly a time capsule. I had to buy the Ram.

Reluctantly I put the Ford up for sale. It sold immediately to a local club member up here who had expressed an interest in it a year or two ago. A little twinge of nostalgia overcame Carol and me, but now I have the truck I was lusting for. Big Red found a new local home; Lil Red is ours. A local club member is already enjoying the Ford as both trucks were admired in our local Brevard hometown Christmas parade. Happy ending.
