


Secretary's Report

The 78th Revival AAA Glidden Tour September 22-27, 2024 Liberty Mountain Resort, Fairfield, Pennsylvania

I remember as a little boy in the 1960's studying my dad's AACA magazines and reading about the Glidden Tour. I was amazed that people were driving horseless carriages and brass era cars on this tour and thought it would be a wonderful adventure to participate in the tour, "someday".

Charles Jasper Glidden was born in 1857 in Lowell, Massachusetts. At an early age, he began working for the Atlantic-Pacific Telegraph Company and helped the company transition from telegraph to telephone service. Glidden then established a syndicate to sell telephone exchanges. In 1900, this enterprise was purchased by Bell Telephone, making Glidden a very wealthy man.

An early advocate of the automobile, in 1901 Glidden and his wife journeyed to the Arctic Circle in a British Napier. By 1908 he had traveled through 39 countries by car. In 1904 Glidden participated in the AAA (American Automobile Association) reliability tour from New York to St. Louis. He wanted to see the event repeated annually and donated an elaborate trophy to the AAA to be awarded on future tours. Accordingly, the tours held between 1905 and 1913 were known as the Glidden Reliability Tours.

In 1946 the Firestone Tire Co. agreed to resume production of tires for antique cars, making it possible for collectors to drive many of these cars for the first time in decades. A group of antique car enthusiasts organized the first Glidden Revival Tour held the same year. The tour has been run every year since under the alternating sponsorship of the AACA and the VMCCA (the Veteran Motor Car Club of America). In 2002, AAA became a joint sponsor of the event.

For background information, my dad was always interested in antique cars and was very knowledgeable about pre-war Packard's. During the 1960's he owned a very original 1935 Ford V-8 cabriolet, it was used in the summer as a weekend car.

Dad worked extremely hard during those years as the sales manager for our family business, a major appliance wholesale distributorship. In addition, there were four children in our family, so dad really did not have the time or the resources to participate in car shows or road tours. Those things did not stop me from dreaming about collecting and touring with vintage cars, "someday".

In 1984 my (then) wife Margaret and I moved to Cleveland, Ohio to help her father following the sudden death of my mother-in-law. The 2 antique cars that dad and I owned at the time followed me to Cleveland: a 1935 Packard Standard Eight and a 1949 Cadillac Series 62 which I still own. I soon became involved with the Northern Ohio chapters of the AACA and the CCCA (the Classic Car Club of America). While in Cleveland I met many knowledgeable people who helped me grow into the hobby.

After moving to the Stuart, FL area in 2010, Don Gilbert and I were hired as the co-Curators for the antique vehicle collection at the Elliott Museum. Our duties included participation in many car shows, and we even started judging at shows and Concours events. During this time, our personal collection grew to include several good tour cars. We began to participate in the TCVCC tours, as well as joining tours hosted by the Packard Club and the Franklin Club. Retirement at the end of 2020 made it possible to seriously consider participating in major tours such as the Glidden.

Our Franklin Club friends, Dan and Anne Russell were part of the organizing committee for this years' Glidden, so we decided that we had to go. We contacted TCVCC members David MacMillian and Janet Gibb who live near Mt. Dora, to see if they wanted to take one of their old cars on the tour.

Glidden Tour continued...

Eligibility for the Glidden Tour is restricted to cars made before WWII (1942 and older). David owns three Franklin's, and originally planned to use his 1931 Franklin convertible for the tour. I registered my 1937 Buick Roadmaster convertible sedan. David knew an independent car transporter from Miami who agreed to take both my car as well as David's car in his rig.

As luck would have it, none of David's Franklins would be ready for the trip, so he substituted his reliable 1929 Ford Model A "Tudor" coach, the "Blue Blaster". Everything was on track with my Buick "Ms. Ethyl", until the generator and voltage regulator failed at the last minute, and I had to substitute my 1930 Franklin sedan.

Our transporter, Eric Diaz picked up the cars on the evening of Thursday September 19th. As soon as the car was on the trailer, we started driving north. David and Janet flew to Hagerstown, Maryland the next day. We arrived at the host hotel on Saturday September 21st, checked in to the hotel and met Eric who arrived right on time with the cars.

The Tour itinerary included a 65-mile countryside tour on Sunday. We took the Franklin and headed out on some very hilly, winding, narrow roads. I have owned the Franklin for several years, but I had never driven it outside of Florida. The car has a very non-forgiving, non-synchromesh 4-speed Detroit transmission. Downshifting and upshifting on the fly in those hills was challenging, but I managed it with minimal gear grinding. The countryside was beautiful, and we had an enjoyable time visiting a winery and a historic Pennsylvania round barn. When we got back to home base, we filled the tank and calculated the car's fuel mileage; 8.2 mpg!

The Glidden Tour is organized as a "hub" tour, much like TCVCC's Cracker Tour. All tour activities revolve around the host hotel with daily tours departing from and returning to that location. There were 112 cars and about 250 people registered for the tour. Surprising to me, there were several cars from the 1910 era touring daily. The most popular age bracket was comprised of cars from the mid to late 1930's.



Tour Chair, Rob Burchill did a wonderful job assembling the tour routes as well as the route/map book, which we found easy to follow. We supplemented the tour book with a portable Garmon GPS unit.

Daily tour routes covered anywhere from about 60 to 130 miles. AAA provided flatbed trucks to bring in broken down vehicles, and there were several of those. There were no Driver's Meetings, nor were there set starting times, so it took us a day or so to

get our bearings and understand how things worked. Participants simply left the hotel whenever they wanted and followed the driving directions for that day.

There were organized coffee breaks and lunch stops. The food was amazing, especially the Maryland crab feast where we received souvenir crab mallets!

We were assigned daily report cards to complete and turn in at the end of the day. Information requested included daily starting time, time of arrival for the coffee break, time of departure from the coffee break, mid-day destination departure time, evening arrival time, total AM touring time in minutes, total PM touring time in minutes, and total elapsed touring time in minutes. Honestly, we did not bother completing these things.



The tour began on Sunday and concluded the following Friday for a total of six driving days. Total tour mileage was around 475 miles. Notable destinations included: The Historic Round Barn and Farmers Market, Cashtown, PA, the Eastern Museum of Motor Racing, York Springs, PA, numerous covered bridges and apple orchards, the Gettysburg

National Military Park and Museum, and the WWII American Experience Museum, both in Gettysburg, PA, the Washington County Education and Agriculture Museum, Boonsboro, MD, the Antietam National Battlefield, Antietam, MD, and a tour of historic Frederick, Maryland including the cemetery where Francis Scott Key is buried.





I am glad that we made the effort to participate in this tour. Would I do it again? *Maybe*, BUT the logistics of getting the cars, as well as us to Pennsylvania and back were complex and expensive. Hurricane Helene hit Florida and North Carolina during the tour, further complicating everything. The weather in Pennsylvania was just horrible the entire time, with constant rain and fog making driving difficult.



Many of the old cars, including mine, suffered interior damage due to leaking roof seals. This was unfortunate and discouraging but nobody could do anything about it. I will consider another national tour if one becomes available closer to home. I doubt that I will ship a car halfway across the country again. The organizers of the tour did an exceptionally fine job putting the events together and I want to congratulate them for a job well done!


