None of the 3 qualified for the race so on race day Char & I sat on pit wall & watched the 500 won by Dale Jarrett Those days in the garage & race days are so special as most of the time it was dear daughter & I. 3 Days at Talladega is special. Stuart Murals, Mosaics, & Sculptures Tour – June 2025 General Meeting Wrap-up

Compliments of our local artists, sculptors, and high school art students, Stuart and Palm City buildings and roundabouts are graced with amazing murals, sculptures, and mosaics that dazzle both residents and tourists alike. For June's general meeting, 30 TCVCC members toured 16 of the many beautiful works of art. Participants were provided a list and thumbnail description of our spotlighted artworks with driving directions, a full-color City of Stuart Art & History Map, and colorful Stuart Main Street-Celebrating 35 Years coasters, the latter two compliments of the Stuart Visitors Information Center with its lovely Yellow Tabebuia mural that we passed by.

We broke into 4 small groups with the intention of departing our first stop, the Palm City Post



Office "Salute to Service" mural in 5-minute intervals to ease parking at each location. But that was like herding cats! I thought I was at the Daytona 500. Eve-

ryone zoomed to their cars and left in a flurry; all except my group of ducklings who actually followed my directions!

On our tour we circled the roundabouts of the bronze Three Heron Monument & The Stuart Sailfish, both sculpted by Geoffrey Smith whose Gallery the Club visited some months ago, and in Haney Circle we saw Lady Abundance, a risqué French remnant from the 1939 NY World's

Fair. Acquired by The Stuart Women's Club in 1941, the prudish townsfolk refused her placement at Haney Circle, so she was relegated to the Courthouse



grounds until "The Naked Lady" was allowed to take her place at Haney Circle in 1991 with the revitalization of Stuart when our moral compass was more relaxed. The mural artwork ranged from a whimsical garden to several that depicted Stuart's history from early Potsdam to Postcards to the vivid House of Refuge. "We Are Makers" portraits of a local artist, sculptor, musician, and chef representing 'Makers, Breakers, Idea Shakers...Crafting By Hand...Taking Chances...Express Our Ideas, Emotions And Views...Inspired By Life, By Dreams And Ambitions... Linked By Passion...' was very poignant.



One of the most unique, and impressive, works of art was in a most unique place. The "Mosaic Trees" tile & stone mural is located on the restroom facility wall at Memorial Park. It turned out to be a welcome stop for more reasons than admiring the art!



The low mosaictiled "East Stuart Gateway Monument" was hard to spot by the ballfield. Several members missed it, despite the fact that the shrubs around it had re-

cently been trimmed. I guess City Maintenance received my telepathic request...lol!

Our tour finished at Duffy's Sport Grill on Osceola Street.

One structure that towered above all the others and above our COOL Car Show was the 1959 City of Stuart Water Tower displaying our Ameri-
