The Long Journey of the DUES Our 2 week trip to the

Pontiac National Convention in Louisville

I bought our 1970 Pontiac Bonneville convertible in 1979. During the past 46 years, we have driven it more than 200,000 miles. In the early 90s, it underwent an "amateur



restoration". was good, but not great. In 2003, took it off the road with the intention of giving it a much more serious restoration

which I estimated might take a year or 2. But it seemed that life got in the way. Several operations, two cancer episodes and the all familiar I got bored. But during the ensuing 23 years I accumulated a lot of NOS parts, when they were still available on eBay and from parts dealers. Earlier this year, with the help of Larry Atkins, Ed Joyce, Don Gilbert and John Giltinan, we got it over the finish line.



Amy and I decided to drive it to the Pontiac Oakland Club International (POCI) show in Louisville KY. To add to that, we decided to visit Mike and Carol Mucci and Bob and Nancy Elzin in North Carolina. Then on to Pennsylvania to visit friends and family and spread the ashes of Amy's mother at her birthplace in Emporium PA. Then a stop back in Pittsburgh for a reunion with my old Drum and Bugle Corps friends. And on a Sunday night we had to drive 6 hours to get close to Louisville so we could arrive early on Monday to put the Dues through tech inspection and arrive in time to go on the scheduled trip to Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Derby Museum. WHEW!

We left Fort Pierce on Thursday afternoon, May 29th. Driving on I-95 and other interstates was a nightmare. Between the rough roads and potholes, numerous heavy rain and the highway hooligans who love zig zagging across 3 or 4 lanes of traffic, not to mention the trucks, it was not a relaxing drive. We were happy to get out of Florida and onto some beautiful, smooth and nearly deserted secondary roads.

Sad, but we knew her mom approved when Amy noticed a bunch of daisy's growing... her mom's favorite!

We spent the rest of the week visiting friends



and some of our old haunts. Then on Sunday we attended a reunion for the Royal Crusaders Drum and Bugle Corps that I helped found in 1969. I never got to participate in their rise to prominence in the mid 70s as I aged out at 21. But now, I am the oldest remaining member. Yes, that DOES make me feel old!

We left the reunion about 4:00 and started driving to Louisville. We needed to get close with a short drive on Monday the 9th. We had to get the car through tech inspection and be on the bus for Churchill Downs by 9:45. We made it with "minutes" to spare. Churchill Downs was spectacular!

I didn't realize how much I remembered watching the Triple Crown races over the years.

The car show was well attended at the convention hall across the street from the Crowne Plaza Hotel.. What a great indoor venue. Very tall ceiling with hundred of lights that made the cars sparkle like diamonds.

After the show, we attended the banquet and awards presentation. When we were awarded a Gold in the points judged original category we were elated. Much like a 1st Junior in AACA, you need to score 360 or better out of 400 points. A great feeling to have all our hard work and miles and miles of driving rewarded!



The next day, Friday the 13th, we headed headed home. We had 3 days so we could take our time and stop when we found something interesting. All told, we drove 3319 miles across 10 states with no real, mechanical issues. We discovered our rear air shocks were deflated, probably from some of the HUGE POTHOLES we encountered. And with the Bonneville's massive trunk, loaded to the brim, they are very necessary to level out the car for better handling. Once reinflated, all was well.

Although the car ran and drove near perfectly, the clutches in the limited slip rear differential were sticking, causing clanging and banging at slow speeds while making sharp turns. Eaton, the manufacturer said the problem was the use of synthetic or semi-synthetic gear oil, which will be corrected by draining and refilling with non-synthetic gear oil and posi additive.

All in all it was a great 18 days. Some thought we might be nuts to drive a 55 year old car that distance. But we did it and will repeat with a similar 2 week trip to Hershey and surrounding areas. Drive them, don't treat 'em like museum pieces.



Post Script: I drained the differential and refilled with non synthetic gear oil and posi-traction additive. The Dues is still on the jack stands, but I am optimistic that this will correct the situation. Also, I installed new bushings in the front sway bar that was almost without them for the trip.

Also on display is Timeless, Robert Farber's Fashion


Photography. The works featured in Timeless are drawn from two major bodies of work:




Our New Old Car




