Hot, Hot, Hot!!! Wow. 2/3 of the year gone. It has flown by & 2 months till the COOL show. Registrations & sponsorships have been flowing in. Russ C is doing an amazing job on the sponsorship end. Russ, thank you so much. Car show season is at a low end. Way too hot

out there. Show season starts Oct 18 with 3 shows in the area.

Let's give the racing history a little break & start with some Pres bio.

Born in N. Wis Christmas eve 1952. Lived in a

very small town, Haugen (pronounced howgan) Means dweller on the hill in Norwegian, Pop 286. Went to an 8 room schoolhouse until 6th grade. Only 3 of us in 1st, 2nd & 3rd grade. My 1st grade teacher was my Dad's 8th grade teacher. Mrs. Florence Sherman. A lady named Adeline Zelesky was our cook. Her meals were awesome! She cooked many ethnic meals & her golden brown rolls were the best. Many, many years later I seen her at our little hometown festival & thanked her for her great cooking.

Going to school was by foot or bicycle. About 1 mile each way. Many times, a detour to Grandma & Grandpas which sat on the lumber mill property. Grandma was a baker & her homemade goods were scrumptious. Miss her lefsa, bierocks, kolache, & cinnamon rolls. We would enter thru the back door & ask Grandma if she had any cookies. Most of the time yes but sometimes she would say yes, but they are store bought & not very good!

Had numerous jobs at the lumber mill from age 10-20. Made thousands of sticker to air dry lumber & piled tons of lumber each summer. Later years were hundreds of miles each day driving trucks delivering lumber & building materials.

High school was 7 miles away, bus early on then the old red truck sophomore on. Excelled in shop, woodworking, art, power mechanics. Snow skiing was my specialty. Lettered all 4 yrs. & was captain of the racing team as a senior. A few years ago, I searched out my 2 main teachers for those areas while in N. Wis thanked them for what they taught me. One was quite moved by the gesture. Feb '73 had enough of the brutal N. Wis winters, high for the 2nd week in Feb '73 was -13 deg. Put all

my belongings in a '62 Buick LeSabre & 26 hrs. later arrived in Stuart, Fla. Started the next day working construction laying concrete decks. The 1st building I worked on is on the corner of US1 & Kanner in the middle of Stuart. A Royal Castle once stood there.

Worked construction for many yrs. Built homes from the bare ground up in '79 & '80. Went through 4 years of carpentry apprenticeship from '73 -'77. Was involved in the union at that time with a '50 cent raise every 6 mos.

This type of work enabled me to build a show winning ISCA World of Wheels vehicle. A '74 Dodge B -100 1/2 ton van. Back in the day Stuart had a van club called Sailfish City Vans. Being the only secretary the club ever had we did many community events. The 4th National truck in was in Bowling Green, Ky. in '76. A must attend event with over 11,000 vans. That was a PARTY!!!

Lived in Stuart, Fla, Lakewood Park (Ft. Pierce), Pt. St. Lucie (a few different places), Worked on the very 1st building in Martin Downs in '79. Lived & worked in Jacksonville, Fla. leading the deck crew, Clearwater, Fla. again running the deck crew on the Countryside Mall in Dunedin, Rio, Palm City 3 different places. Lived behind the Amoco station on the corner off Mapp Rd. & Martins downs Hwy. for 6 years. Had a problem with an employer in '91 which caused a major problem with my house in Palm city. Char became my savior! Have been here on Leigh Ave for the last 33 years & have literally rebuilt the whole house & added a 2 1/2 car garage in the back yard. The shop / garage was where the furniture / cabinet business Strictly Custom was run out of for 34 yrs. It served me well & have done some business with TCVCC members.

During the 80's was involved with the Martial Arts, glass & mirror etching & canine Frisbee competition. My buddy Bleu (German Shepherd & Doberman mix, a \$10 special out of the Flashes shopping paper) placed 6 out of 7 states in '83, 1984 & '85 Fla. state Champion & '86 Ala. state Champion. He had more awards than I did with the show van!!

All take care, have safe last 1/3 of '25 & try to contribute to the COOL show by BAGI Be Active Get Involved, Thanks, Denny



Cars of Central Europe May 2025

We were fortunate to be able to take a nice tour of Central Europe that included Poland, Hungary, Austria, Slovakia and the Czech Republic.

As with any journey to Europe I am always on the look out for cats or American Iron. On this trip, both were particularly difficult to spot.



On one past trip to Talinn, Estonia, I actually saw an old 1968 Pontiac Catalina parked in the downtown. It was looking tired, but when I checked Google Earth Street view, it was visible there.

In Warsaw, Poland we spotted this 1934 Cadillac 355D Series 30 Fleetwood 7 passenger limousine. This car belonged to the "father of Polish independence Marshal Jozef Pilsudski. It participates in the annual independence day celebration on November 11. The car was specially commissioned and had bullet proof windows. It is surprising that the car survived ww2 and did not become a trophy

for the Nazis, however authorities escaped with it to Romania. It returned to Poland during the communist era, and its original owner was so hated by the communist that it was used for target practice.

It is now on permanent display in front of the presidential palace.

Last year in Vienna, Austria we saw a number of these running around. As best as I can tell, they are a combination of custom body work made to look like an antique car, but using the running gear of some type of electric golf cart. This one looks like it could seat 5 passengers and the driver. As the day was a bit drizzly, the top was up. Our tight schedule again prevented us from taking a ride.

In Prague, Czech Republic, we encountered this concession. Again the body work is made to look like an antique, but this one has gas powered running gear and of course is a stick shift. 80eu for 4 people for 40 minutes for a tour around the city seemed like a good deal, and after having been denied 2 other times, I implored my fellow travellers to give it a try which they did grudgingly.But when it was said and done, they enjoyed the freedom of convertible life without having to navigate the cobblestone streets, tram cars, buses, cars, tourists, horse drawn carriages and pedestrians of the city.

To the left you can see the gear shift and pedal setup. I can personally attest to it's quickness and good brakes as they were both tested as the driver worked his way through the traffic. Yes, it had seatbelts, and they were mandatory. It also had a soft top which was up due to rain, but had been put down just before we arrived on the sce-

During the course of our tour in Prague, I saw this vehicle that was being used by a hotel for publicity purposes. I don't know if it is old or new as we were moving fairly quickly. If I was guessing, it looked like an old paddy wagon. Maybe someone can identify it

Riding around in a classic appearing car in Prague is obviously a big deal, as there is a line of them waiting for the tourist \$.

These seem like they would be a lot of fun to just run around town in, but I could not easily find the manufacturer.




