Covered Bridges and Our New England Quest by Sandee Searle

Mike & Sandee Searle visited Mike's Sis, Mary Ann (MAS), in NH where she is spending a fun summer working at Jellystone Campground;



think Yogi & Boo Boo Bears! We toured NH, VT, & ME and experienced a wide variety of tourist-y activities from the comfort of our new (11 mi odometer) rented Nissan Sentra.

Sandee was determined to see covered bridges in VT & NH. Mike's map skills from his early trucking days led us to 13 single or 2-lane bridges and 1 pedestrian bridge. Two bridges have been converted to alternative uses - a gift shop and a picnic haven by a small brook. The

oldest bridge we crossed was Taftsville Bridge, built 1836. It is the 2nd longest and 3rd oldest covered bridge in VT. The Cornish-



Windsor bridge, aka the kissing bridge, is the longest (449 ft) historic two lane covered bridge in the world. Two interesting facts about it, 1) it was very popular for residents to cross the CT River from 'dry' VT into 'wet' NH and 2) the entrance sign reads, "WALK YOUR HORSES OR PAY TWO DOLLARS FINE"!

We rode the world's oldest cog railway to the 6,288' summit of Mt. Washington, NH.



The rack & pinion mechanism enables the train to climb the mountain's average grade of 25% and the world's steepest trestle, Jacob's Ladder,

which is a whopping 37.41% grade. The railway has been privately owned by 6 generations of the same family for 119 yrs. Afterward we wandered through their Red Barn Museum of antique vehicles. We admired several Stage-coaches, a rare 1918 Pierce Arrow Model 48 B-5 Touring Car (1 of 10 remaining), and a 1938 Ford "Woodie".

An afternoon cruise aboard the U.S. Mail boat, Sophie C, which has been delivering mail to islands in Lake Winnipesaukee since 1945, became a little perilous when a thunder & lightning storm rolled in. Passengers scurried from the open top deck to the enclosed lower deck and Sophie C took refuge at one island's dock until the lightning subsided.

We toured Calvin Coolidge's birthplace & home in Plymouth Notch VT and saw the Bible his notary father used to swear him in as the 30th U.S. President following President Harding's sudden death in Office. We also viewed from afar Walker's Point Estate, aka the Bush Compound, at Kennebunkport ME.

Have you ever worn a leather falconry glove and participated with trained birds of prey? Well, neither have we.



We opted to only observe as we accompanied our group of 10 at the New England Falconry. The Falconer demonstrated with a Harris Hawk, weighing just 1.5 lbs. Six participants landed the hawk. The bird of prey demonstrated his natural instincts by sometimes pouncing, with talons ready, on live crickets he spied on the grass rather than flying to the easily accessible raw beef tucked in the glove pouch.

We watched glassblowers at the renown Simon Pearce Glass & Pottery shop in Quechee VT (I love pronouncing that). They produce customblown glassware for the U.S. State Dept, etched with our country's Seal. The glassware is gifted to Foreign Embassies representing American craftsmanship & diplomacy. The store, filled with lovely vases, glassware, & baubles, was too rich for my pocketbook, so we opted for lunch, one of our best meals, in their charming restaurant overlooking the Ottoquechee River waterfall & covered bridge. In 2023, after heavy rain, the river flooded the flagship store's lower-level studio, hydroelectric turbine, and left muddy debris in the store and restaurant. Photos displayed their damage.

You ask, was there any ice cream? Well, of course! We shared a maple cream, which was delicious, at Bragg Farm Sugarhouse. We couldn't resist bringing home some VT maple syrup too. They tap their trees and collect the sap in buckets. I didn't know that some farms use tubing to collect the sap. Then we headed to the Ben & Jerry's factory tour in Waterbury VT where we tasted cookie dough pieces and the ice cream flavor of the day. Mike is 18 pints tall and Sandee, 16 pints.

At Hope Cemetery in Barre VT, we observed unique marble headstones with shapes as diverse as a soccer ball, cello, airplane, race car, an easy chair, pyramids and more.

Covered Bridges and Our New England Quest ...

We toured the Morgan Horse Farm, originally built for breeding, then operated by USDA for U.S. Cavalry horse breeding, and finally donated to the UVM for their Veterinary program and public education about this magnificent breed, all descended from ______

one horse, *Figure*.

What's a vacay without tastings? We tried our share of beer at Von Trapp's Inn & Brewery (Stowe VT), wine at Shelburne Vinyard (VT), scones at King Arthur's Baking Co. & School (Norwich VT), VT cheese & maple syrup at Sugarbush Farm (Woodstock VT), maple ice cream & more maple syrup at Bragg Farm (E. Montpelier VT), pancakes at Polly's Pancake Parlor (Sugar Hill NH), and chocolate at Lake Champlain Chocolates (Burlington VT).

We had a terrible scare when our new rental car began making screeching & scraping sounds on our drive to Sugarbush maple farm on a gravel & potholed road. After finding no apparent undercarriage problem on several stops along the seemingly unending road, we transitioned to a highway. At 50mph a rock, stuck in the wheel well, popped up, hit the car, and the screeching stopped. We happily continued to Wilder VT to view spectacular July 4th fireworks over a river.

In Kennebunkport we visited the Seashore Trolley Museum whose mission is to, "... share powerful connections between the past and the present...to preserve knowledge, context and resources for future generations by collecting, restoring, operating and exhibiting significant public transit vehicles and artifacts". We rode in the Wheeling Traction Co. car and spoke with long-time volunteers, many from various new England & New York public transit careers, about their passion & dedication to trolley restorations and public education. On display were trolley cars from NY, Montreal, Philly, USPO, Suffolk Co. MA Sheriff's Office, and many more in varying stages of restoration.



We stopped at Dog Mountain in St. Johnsbury NH to visit Stephen Huneck's Dog Chapel & Gallery to pay homage to the memory of our eight Greyhounds. Stephen built a beautiful small chapel in the image of a New England church where people could leave pet photos and loving memory notes on the wall. He could not have envisioned, when the chapel opened in 2000, that the walls would overflow with notes and photos which are removed annually and archived on site. The dog-themed stained-

glass windows reflect beautifully on Stephen's hand-carved dog pews. Stephen's brainchild chapel came to him as a vision while recovering from a critical illness and long coma. His wife Gwen helped him to a full recovery. Sadly, Stephen died in 2010, and Gwen followed in 2013. The chapel & gift shop are operated by his foundation and run by friends and volunteers.






