Greetings Fellow TCVCCer's!

In my last Prez Say, you might remember that my 64 GTO was suffering from a starting problem at the June Meeting. Although it seemed to charge up just fine, the next day the



battery was dead as expected. I pulled it out, and saw the sticker 08-19. It was one month short of 3 years. I took it in, and had it tested. DOA, it would not charge beyond 12 volts. \$193 later, I had the exact same battery that had cost me about \$85 in 2019. I noticed that the bolt that secures the hold down was a little rusty, so I sanded and painted. Well that lead to daily ritual of removing items, cleaning painting etc. The final touch being a new set of stock chrome valve covers as the existing ones had gotten pitted over 15 years of use. My engine compartment now looks significantly better though I have suffered a recent setback. On a very tight turn, either a fitting or hose on my power steering is shooting a mist of fluid towards the firewall. That's next to investigate.

One of my old friends from the GTO club, Rick Hector met us on a tour when we went to Dagwoods in Vero Beach, and has enlisted me for advice during the restoration of the 1966 GTO that his father purchased new from Colonial Pontiac in Miami. In 1995, he had the body removed from the chassis, and the chassis was completely restored before the funds ran dry. The body was gently placed back on the chassis where it has sat for 27 years due to a marriage, and 2 kids etc.

As his Dad is now in his 80's, and his mom has just recently passed on, Rick realized that if he was going to finish this restoration, it needed to be now. I'm glad to say that it is progressing nicely. I visited with him, and we developed a shopping list of immediate needs, and the sequencing of events, and the body was dropped off for rust repair and paint on July 25.

The shop forecasts it will be done in 4 weeks, but for the sake of logistics, I hope it takes them twice as long. The main reason for that is that it would give him time to get the engine assembled, and the drivetrain connected so that it could be installed in the car before the front sheet metal is reinstalled. One can only hope and dream!

Someone mentioned that we had been there before, but although I recollect going to a garage in the area, I don't remember this collection. 
