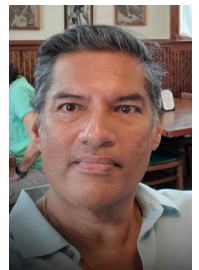

### TCVCC General Meeting

October 23, 2022
