





## King Tut in Review By Sandee Searle

The April General Meeting was an enlightening visit to see In Celebration of King Tut, an exhibit of amazing replicas of the Egyptian relics at The Elliott Museum. Our docent-led tour provided interesting facts about British archaeologist and Egyptologist Howard Carter's 1922 archaeological discovery of the young King's hidden tomb and elaborate gold and gem-encrusted Egyptian artifacts that are permanently on display in Egypt's museums.





King Tutankhamun became Pharaoh in 1332 BC at the tender age of eight following the death of his father, King Akhenaten. He was the Boy King, ruling for only10 years until his untimely death, most likely from complications of infection from a knee injury and malaria.

Three fascinating artifacts were the nesting anthropoid coffins, the golden chariot, and the Rosetta Stone. King Tut's mummified body was laid to rest in a solid gold coffin fashioned in his image which nested inside two more gold-plated and gem adorned wood coffins, also carved in his image. Think of them as life-sized Russian Matryoshka dolls, only extremely heavy.

## King Tut in Review, continued...

One of Tut's favorite pastimes was racing chariots. The gilded chariot on display was a ceremonial chariot adorned with painted figures including a protective eye on either side.





The Rosetta Stone which should belong to Egypt has been at The British Museum for over two centuries. On this 2'x3.25' black granite stone is a Ptolemaic decree from 196 BC inscribed in ancient Greek, Egyptian, and hieroglyphics. This stone was instrumental in deciphering hieroglyphics. What amazed me was how straight and even the lines and characters were, as if they had been lasered into the stone over two millennia ago.

If you missed our meeting, the Exhibit will be at The Elliott until May 31<sup>st</sup>. Seeing these antiquities is well worth your time.

After our tour we enjoyed a tasty lunch outside The Elliott at the Philly Down South Tiki Hut. Thanks to the 27 members and two guests who joined us.
