To be clear, this cruise was not an officially scheduled TCVCC/AACA Club function, but rather the result of Mary Ann and other club member's curiosity to see how many TCVCC members might have an interest in taking a short cruise together. If there was enough interest, participants could qualify for a discounted group rate. Well, there was more than enough interest, and the TCVCC gang set sail the 23rd through the 27th of September. As a "first time cruiser", I can tell you we had a blast together! After well over a decade of holding the TCVCC membership fee at \$25, your BOD approved a \$5 increase in club dues for 2025 at its September Board meeting. At \$30 a year, your club dues are still a tremendous bargain, as the club combines the dues with revenue from our COOL Car Show to make our monthly membership activities more affordable, or in some cases, free. As an example, the Dauer Museum of Classic Cars charges a \$20 per person admission fee, but participants in TCVCC's September event paid only \$5 per person to see the Dauer. Since most of our memberships represent two people, that's a savings of \$30 per couple in September alone! That's just one example...the more often you participate in the club's monthly activities, the greater benefit you receive.

The Lane Museum, Nashville, Tennessee

In planning our annual trip north to visit relatives and grandkids we chose to go to Chicago area first this year. This route takes us right thru Nashville Tennessee. In Nashville there is a unique car museum unlike most others—the Lane Museum. The Lane Museum claim that they have the largest European car collection in the U.S. They have 150 vehicles on display with another 350 stored in non viewing areas in the old bakery building. The admission is \$10.00 per senior, \$15.00 for you youngins below 64.

This museum is not the ordinary muscle car, or high end luxury car type of place. They have many, many odd ball, one of a kind, home built futuristic, and just plane weird cars that you will never see anywhere else. The museum opens at 10:00 a.m. and there is a live demonstration at 11:00.



The live demonstration given on our day visiting was the 1932 Helicron, a one only wooden propeller driven car found in a barn in France in 2000. After restoring the car the museum added a windshield to better protect the driver from the wind blast that it takes to drive the car. The curator claims that they have driven the car on Nashville streets at 30 mph! Crazy!! Once they started the car and throttled it to only half speed the noise drowned out any conversation in the whole museum.

There are so many oddities it is impossible to list them all but a few notable cars were the 1948 Larmar at only 2'4" wide (yes it is displayed driving thru a door frame), a car that ran on coal thru WW2 due to the gas shortages, many 3 wheeled cars, plus futuristic cars of the 50's and 60's.



Jim has restored some of the vehicles in the Lane Museum. He had sent me photos of the Baby about a year ago (in progress restoration and completed restoration). Fortunately the Baby was on display and was easily accessible to view (you can walk around and touch all of the vehicles in the museum, no ropes or barricades). Jim's level of restoration is concours quality and was way more beautiful in person than the pictures he sent.

Besides the interesting uniqueness of the place in general we had a specific car we were looking for in the display. The 1947 Davis Divan "Baby" a 3 wheeled car capable of taking turns at 50mph with out rolling over was restored by Jim Biery. Jim is one of the grandsons of the original owner of our 1928 Graham Brothers. Jim operated a highend car repair

shop in Pittsburgh until 2015. The Graham was stored in his garage when we purchased it in 2003.



For any of you driving thru the Nashville area and would like to see some really different vehicles I recommend stopping in!



INTERVIEW WITH DICK HOFFMAN

In 2016, after sixty years of riding motorcycles around the world without an injury or accident, Dick Hoffman decided it was time to retire. During an enjoyable, and very nostalgic, interview with Dick and his wife, Molly, their love of riding became very evident.

Dick started riding when he was sixteen years old on a Cushman motor scooter, then progressed upward to Honda motorcycles going from a 350cc to 1500cc. While working in the engineering department of Factory Mutual Insurance, he met three other guys who also rode and the four amigos rode together for more than 42 years.

Dick's motorcycling can be divided into three segments – touring, long-distance rallies and antique cycle collecting.

Dick, and with Molly most times, has toured in all 50 states (yes, includes Alaska and Hawaii), many European countries and all providences of Canada except the Northwest Territory. Riding through the Swiss Alps with all the cut backs was one of the most memorable rides he made with Molly. (Ask her about that sometime!) Traveling on the "back roads" when possible gave them the opportunity to visit with the local people which added much to their travels.

The long-distance rallies segment of Dick's riding includes the Three Flags, The Four Corners, and the grand daddy of all long distance riding – The Iron Butt.

The Three Flags is a ride from Canada through the United States to Mexico. The second time he participated, the ride was from Mexico through the United States and concluded in Canada. He did this ride in two days each time.

The Four Corners is a ride touching the farthest points of the four corners of the US – Madawaska, Maine; Blaine, Washington; San Ysidro, California; and Key West, Florida – for a total of 8,000 miles. Dick did this in an amazing time of eight days!

The Iron Butt was a rally/race consisting of 24 riders who rode 11 days and covered 11,000 miles. During this race, Dick set a record of riding 1,600 miles in 26 hours without stopping except for gas.

The most fun ride in the long distance series of rides is when he took Molly to Hawaii for her birthday. On the way to Hawaii he mentioned, by the way, there is a motorcycle race/rally around the big island – must ride 1,000 miles in 24 hours. Well he finished that 1,014 miles in 19 hours. There are no major highways on that island so it was riding round and round and round it until one finishes 1,000 miles under 24 hours.

The third segment of Dick's cycle experience was collecting antique cycles. At one time he amassed Triumphs, BSA's, Norton, Ariel, Suzuki, BMW and some rare bikes like the Suzuki Rotary and a Honda which would red line at 11,000 rpm. This hobby took Dick and Molly to many shows and auctions around the country.

When I asked what he and Molly did when it rained, they both said "we just keep riding because on the other side of the storm will be sunshine. Just like in life, if one stops you'll get rained on. just keep going and you will find sunshine."
